Dear Valued Customer,

On August 22, 2012, the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) adopted a rule mandated by the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act to require companies to publicly disclose their use of conflict minerals (tantalum, tin, gold or tungsten) that originated in the Democratic Republic of Congo ("DRC") or adjoining countries.

In order to determine if the minerals were sourced from the DRC or an adjoining country, a company that uses any of the designated minerals is required to conduct a reasonable "country of origin" inquiry that must be performed in good faith and be reasonably designed to determine whether any of its minerals being used have originated from the DRC, and/or adjoining countries, or from scrap or recycled sources.

We are working with our own suppliers to understand the sources of the metals contained in the products that they sell to assure there are no Conflict Minerals in our Supply Chain. Our Purchasing Terms and Conditions reinforce this policy with all our suppliers. In addition, Saline Lectronics Inc. requires our largest suppliers to verify in writing that they have procedures in place to demonstrate that the minerals they procure are sourced in accordance with this policy.

I have provided, with this letter, a copy of our "List of Sources for Conflict Minerals", based on information provided by our mainstream suppliers in response to our recent inquiries. We will continue to monitor this sourcing information with due diligence to ensure that we continue to support the guidelines of this humanitarian act.

Saline Lectronics Inc. is not a publicly held company so we are not obligated by this act to file a "Conflict Minerals Reporting Template (EICC Form)" response with the SEC. However, we will be more than willing to share any and all pertinent information relative to our "legitimate" sourcing of these Conflict Minerals moving forward, to the best of our knowledge.
